

There are approximately 80,000 Holocaust survivors living in the United States today, and nearly one-third live at or below the poverty level, making it all but impossible to access the care and support services they so desperately need. The aging of this vulnerable population is exacerbating their profound need as compounding health issues accompany advancing years. Survivors often have special oral health needs, as many experienced prolonged nutritional deprivation and received little or no dental care throughout their childhoods, compromising their lifelong oral health.

Program Overview

In response to this need, Alpha Omega International Dental Society, formerly known as Alpha Omega International Dental Fraternity, and Henry Schein, Inc. developed the Alpha Omega-Henry Schein Cares Holocaust Survivors Oral Health Program. By increasing Holocaust survivors' access to oral care, this program is meeting a critical need and significantly enhancing the overall health and quality of life of this underserved population.

The program provides pro bono oral care to the most economically vulnerable Holocaust survivors, as well as individuals of any faith who are survivors of Nazi persecution and meet the eligibility requirements of the program. In addition to financial need, the three critical factors in prioritizing patients for participation are: elimination of pain, restoration of function, and lack of dental coverage. A clear set of clinical guidelines directs the specific scope of care provided through this program. The scope of treatment is wide and comprehensive, ranging from emergency care to restorative, endodontic, periodontal, oral surgery, and prosthetic treatment—all expertly delivered free of charge.





Collaborating For Impact: An Exemplary Public-Private Partnership

The Alpha Omega-Henry Schein Cares Holocaust Survivors Oral Health Program is a shining example of the powerful impact of strategic collaboration across sectors. The program was created in response to then-Vice President Joe Biden's 2013 call to action inviting the private sector and nonprofit organizations to launch innovative programs to help Holocaust survivors and his spearheading of the appointment of the first-ever Special Envoy for Holocaust Survivor Services, Ms. Aviva Sufian, in 2014. This public-private partnership was officially launched at a meeting at the White House in December 2014.

Henry Schein provides in-kind services, while Town & Country Dental Studios and GCDL, the program's laboratory partners in the United States, and Orthodent Ltd. in Canada, as well as other dental laboratories, donate crowns, dentures, and other appliances necessary for proper patient care. All dental work is completed under the clinical guidance of Dr. Allen Finkelstein, CEO of Bedford HealthCare Solutions. Finally, a number of philanthropic partners generously contribute the essential financial resources needed to operate the program, managed and directed through the Alpha Omega International Dental Society. The Claire Friedlander Family Foundation and the Robert I. Schattner Foundation, Inc. serve as Program Guardians.



As members of the Alpha Omega International Dental Society, we have the opportunity to do an incredible mitzvah by providing pro bono dental care to Holocaust survivors who suffered unimaginable horrors. We can use our skills to restore their dental health, make a positive impact in their lives, and truly give them a reason to smile. During the pandemic, it became apparent to me that many survivors were not able to leave their homes to seek dental care, even when they were in pain. When CJE referred this patient to the program, I was unable to find an open office that could treat him. I realized that this gentleman lived down the block from me, so it just seemed natural to me to help him in any way that I could. I stopped by just to see what he needed. When I saw that he needed new dentures, I was able to take impressions, do a try in, deliver and adjust the dentures in his kitchen! He was able to obtain new dentures without leaving his house! Although his English was minimal, he was able to communicate with me by using a translator program on his computer and I used his computer to respond to him.

My favorite part of the experience was listening to his stories during and after the war. After fighting against the Nazis and being sent to a camp, he went on to become a true rocket scientist and helped build Sputnik. Taking care of this patient brought me tremendous joy during this challenging time. I hope we never become too busy and so complacent that we forget about tzedakah and kindness. Program Impact during COVID-19 Pandemic

The results achieved through this program have been profound, both in terms of the impact upon the lives of the survivors and the multi-faceted engagement of numerous stakeholders. Since its inception, the program has provided nearly 1,600 Holocaust survivors across North America with pro bono dental care valued at over \$3.9 million, with an operating expenditure budget of approximately \$200,000 per year.

In mid-March 2020, the outbreak of the COVID-19 pandemic emerged as a global public health crisis impacting the health and livelihoods of individuals and communities around the world. Older individuals around the world have been among the most profoundly impacted by the pandemic; Holocaust survivors are of particular concern. Most are in their 80s and 90s and are at high risk of experiencing the life-threatening complications associated with this virus. For the elderly, sheltering in place further creates feelings of isolation and loneliness.

Participating dentists provided emergency, urgent treatment in their offices whenever possible during this shutdown, and even delivered care in the homes of Holocaust survivors when needed. Following guidelines issued by the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), the American Dental Association (ADA), and individual states, dental offices were closed for approximately 12 weeks. As restrictions were eased, participating dentists were able to resume the regular cadence of care. The commitment of the program's dentists, social service agency partners, industry partners, philanthropic partners, and others to delivering care to this vulnerable population over the course of the pandemic has been nothing short of extraordinary.





Holocaust survivors have exhibited strength and perseverance while overcoming many hardships. Sadly, so many live in poverty. The Alpha Omega-Henry Schein Cares Holocaust Survivors Oral Health Program meets a critical need by providing access to dental care to this vulnerable population. Access to care is especially important during the pandemic because prolonged dental issues lead to a deterioration of one's overall health. Increasing Patient Participation Through Enhanced Partner Engagement

Success in expanding the program is the result of educating referring agencies about the unmet need for oral care within their service communities and the tremendous benefits available to those eligible for the program.

In the New York region, we found that the number of referrals was low, despite the number of survivors living in the area. Over the last several years, we re-doubled our efforts in the region. We have held many round table meetings with social service agencies, and the results have been spectacular. In 2019, the value of the donated dental care in the New York area was nearly \$250,000. The program was on a growth trajectory, then the global pandemic hit affecting all of us. The pandemic created challenges for everyone involved in the program including the dentists and dental office staff, dental labs, and especially the patients. While the pandemic has shown us the importance of this program as a true safety net for this population, our performance also give reassurance to those most vulnerable. Even in this most challenging time, participating dentists have been able to respond to survivors' pressing dental needs, providing quality dental care with compassion and kindness.

On September 24–September 25, 2019, The Jewish Federations of North America/Center for Advancing Holocaust Survivor Care held a workshop on Aging & Trauma: Innovations in Person-Centered, Trauma-Informed Care for Diverse Older Populations. Dr. Marcy Borofsky, AO dentist, daughter of Holocaust survivors, and philanthropic donor to the dental program, and Dr. J. Steven Kahan, AO Past International President and AO DC Alumni Chapter member, participated in a round table discussion. Approximately 200 attendees, many of them our social service agency partners, attended. This was one of the last in-person workshops that was held prior to the start of the pandemic.

Through our intensive efforts to effectively engage our social service agency partners, the referral volume has steadily increased, reflecting the high unmet need for oral care within the communities they serve. When the program commenced in 2015, we were able to treat 145 patients. We have now treated approximately 1,600 Holocaust survivors!

Becoming a Dental Home

The program is not only meeting a critical need for emergency oral health services but is also helping to create a "dental home" for many of the patients served. By increasing Holocaust survivors' access to oral care, the program seeks to significantly enhance their overall quality of life.

We found that the average value of the care provided per patient decreases as a result of the program's success in retaining patients who originally entered the program for high-value emergency treatment, but have subsequently returned to access the routine care they need to maintain good oral health throughout the remainder of their lives. The program's high return rate reflects the exceptional service provided to patients by dentists who donate their services.
